### IRS approves charity status for law enforcement advocates, ready to help agents

Chino, CA – The Law Enforcement Officers Advocates Council’s application for 501c3 tax-exempt status has just been approved by the IRS. LEOAC is ready to launch fundraising efforts to assist America’s law enforcement officers. Legal fees can be expensive for officers, which is why we need the public’s help to make it affordable. Our team has an unparalleled track record in criminal and administrative cases.

LEOAC is a multifaceted non-partisan, non-profit organization, which assists law enforcement officers regardless of agency, or union affiliation. Our primary purpose is to educate the public about the duties and responsibilities of federal law enforcement officers. We assist "whistleblowers" in disclosing critical information; aid in providing attorneys to agents who are subjects of questionable prosecutions, or being terminated from their positions; assist officers and their families through charitable donations on a case by case basis (per IRS regs), conduct extensive information gathering and analysis, determine case merit; and speak authoritatively on law enforcement issues. We advocate, educate, and litigate – when necessary.

“This crisis goes far beyond civilian knowledge when it comes to political compromises, targeting officers, and the culture of corruption while many in Congress generally ignore it. I have investigated these issues since 2004, discovering a pattern of politically motivated prosecutions, and rampant misconduct by the justice department, courts, and inside our federal law enforcement agencies responsible for the security of America. We have a dream team that came together to meet these issues head on. We will continue to ask questions that Congress apparently refuses to ask,” stated Ramirez.

“We want the public to be aware that law enforcement officers can come to us and be very comfortable in having us as a resource for we offer many services on a pro-bono basis. For those who believe we’re trying to do a union’s job, we supplement their work. As many of our members are retired federal law enforcement personnel, we are independent of the agency’s employing America’s officers and can’t be ordered to sit silently with one’s career hanging over them. In fact the experience of our team is extraordinary and unprecedented, as we have retired managers and rank and file personnel, along with top attorneys, and civilian experts. I am honored to be a part of this team who are dedicated to the best interests of our nation and law enforcement,” concluded Ramirez.

“It is an undisputed fact that misconduct permeates the management ranks of our federal law enforcement agencies, and that such misconduct is far too often directed against honest, hard working law enforcement officers who have sworn to protect our nation and are simply doing their jobs. Whenever possible this organization will expose misconduct and corruption in government and demand accountability from those in power in all branches of government” said Sandalio Gonzalez, Executive Vice President of LEOAC and retired Special Agent in Charge in the Drug Enforcement Administration.
